  - Summary of programs: challenge of student retention, marketing and retaining the VN program staff with instructors
  - HS and GED: lots of interests, but struggle to get the students persist and complete their programs
  - Will offer new class: Literacy in Spanish for K-12 parent support education
  - O UVAH update:
    - Expanding activities offered to AWD clients
  - offering educational opportunities—this coming spring, 4 clients enrolled at Mendocino College for LRS (Learning Skills classes)
  - Another life skills program update: combining Mayacama, Life Services and local church offered their kitchen to have cooking classes together.
  - Ramping up customized and competitive integrated job skills training—looking to partner with local employers and businesses to get paid internship for our clients.
  - Looking to partner with regional centers and Department of Rehabilitation—Work experience program 300 hours and the clients paid by DOR—businesses not obligated to hire them but UVAH personnel is there to give support
  - Fun activities: Halloween parties and film viewing

## Mendocino County of Education–Tami Mee (<u>Annual Review Form 2022</u>)

- o MA-offered in the community of 30 years.
- ■Set backs during COVID due to restrictions
- ■All our programs are operated with the student fees—no funds from MCOE.
- ■Strengths: effective coordination of community externship locations, great instructors and community reputation of having "great students and MAs" who are employed around the different local health care facilities/clinics
- ■Challenges of marketing, scholarship and financial aid to students (Career Point helps with this)
- was offered to partner more with Alliance for Rural Health and Clinics which will provide financial assistance to students for their training
- O As with MA, DA struggled to increase enrollment after Covid. We are slowly starting to see increased enrollment numbers. We have a wonderful instructor and students are doing well.
- o Phlebotomy: during 21/22-
- ■Most popular program;
- ■Strengths: Adequate enrollment, instructors, effective coordination of clinical partners
- ■Challenges: Low faculty retention, Marketing, spend the CAEP fundings on books and supplies
- ■One-time funding from MLACE on teacher credentialing programs
- Lake County of Education

  - Strengths of Programs:

Instructor is highly effective and popular, with a positive reputation in the community, which helps with recruitment

Even stronger partnership with clinical site, resulting in full scholarships for students and more

O Challenges in 21/22

Student retention and Student enrollment\*

Low faculty retention, Inadequate personnel ,Lack of space





Each cohort was approximately ½ enrolled, with a total number of enrolled students of 15, with 30 possible.

Steps to resolve Challenges 21/22

More early advertising

Needs assessment if advanced level class needed

Create and distribute flyers 3 months ahead X Network with other agencies Other: Deepen relationships with healthcare, education, and workforce partners, optimally resulting in increased enrollments and new student scholarships/sponsorships

Goals for next year

Increase enrollment and retention by 30% each year Other Gather longitudinal data on students

Summary/notes:

Our instructor, in partnership with a strong new C.N.A. RN Program Director, are an excellent instructional team, and students find both success and joy in this program

Enrollment numbers were not high in 21-22, but it was a building year, and in 22-23 we are reaping the benefits. There is continued work to do around advertising/marketing, retention, and educating students about medical pathways available to them once the program is done.

Additionally, we need a sustained strategy for gathering and recording longitudinal student data.
