- 7. Guest Speaker—guest speakers share and present information to the group about their services and scope of services that are relevant to adult learners, and adult and career education.
 - a. Pamela Heston-Director of Employer Partnership, North Far North Workforce Development Consortium
 - In April of this year, we held a Lake County Healthcare Education Summit
 - We were able to get all of the universities in the room and representatives from other agencies like community-based organizations.
 - We also had emergency responder personnel.
 - There is a lot of need for community health care workers.
 - We would like to build and fill the gaps in the community workforce.
 - Megan Tunzi (mtunzi@mcoe.us) from Fort Bragg is a great partner and her and I are talking about how to bridge gaps between students and employment.
 - For instance, there's a heavy equipment logging operation apprenticeship out of Shasta College.
 - That apprenticeship means free housing on site, automatic job placement, and they're getting paid while they're taking this apprenticeship.
 - Northstatecareers.org is a great website for students to go and look.
 - If you have students that are interested, please have them explore these opportunities because there is very limited placement, age bracket is 18 and up.
 - This is a SPI program (Sierra Pacific Industries)
 - Kathy- Is there a lot of people that have graduated and are looking for something in particular?
 - Pamela- We are targeting everybody, even those who do not have a high school diploma.
 - Kathy- I am looking into helping students who are healthcare workers and work in private homes
 that can benefit from furthering their education and exploring other opportunities without the need
 of a high school diploma.
 - Pamela- Jen Bevington, I can connect you she is K16 Redwood Collaborative out of Sonoma State.
 - Pamela- I recommend the CVC which they can enroll on college online even if they cannot be there in person.

- b. Program Review for Agencies for 2023/24 –activities and use of CAEP funds (one-time and annual allocation) to the consortium during the Program Review dates.
 - Amanda Xu-
 - Today is the last day of the semester, we are winding down and then getting ready to start the new semester.
 - We've had dual enrollment focused summer sessions at the centers for the last few summers, and we're broadening it now.
 - This consists of a morning and an afternoon class, if you pass both, you get a \$300 stipend and free lunch included as well as a trip at the end of the semester. These are focused on transfer level courses.
 - We are coordinating in April a Native American cultural gathering at the Coast Center.
 - Jackie Orozco- HSE Program Review
 - It is very important to have a screening of the students so we understand how to guide them after they complete their HSE Certification.
 - About 65% of students are enrolled in BSK classes.
 - o About 95% of students continue to take college courses after HSE Graduation.
 - Euline- We definitely do need to make a collaborative effort in serving HSE students and their interests.
 - Matt Russell LCOE Program Review
 - Activities: changes in personnel, programs, innovations, new methods of delivery, curriculum, etc.
 - High School Diploma program has expanded to having an office at Mendocino
 - College Lake Center.
 - Additional Program Assistant hired to support the High School Diploma program.
 - Additional funding sources for the CNA program have allowed us to be more flexible in acquiring curriculum and resources for the expanded HSD program.
 - Dave- Do you have a poster for your diploma program?
 - Tami Mee MCOE Program Review- Just like LCOE we offer a Medical Assistant
 - Our courses are all state licensing exams
 - We prepare students for Phlebotomy state exam also.
 - Students can work as an MA without a certification if the physician is willing to hire you.
 - You can tell where we really struggled with Covid, and coming out of Covid and getting our numbers back up.
 - It was just a scary time to work in healthcare and financially, a lot of people weren't working so they couldn't afford enrollment fees.
 - It was also challenging for students to complete their clinical portion since sites were not allowing employees that were not from the medical facility.
 - Only 9 students completed their MA from 2021-2022 through 2022-2023.
 - We have bumped up in our most recent year, to 23 students who completed their MA.
 - o For Dentist Assistant we run two cohorts per year.
 - We have all 3 cohorts starting in January.
 - All of our Programs are fee based, these are our main source of income besides one-time money from MLACE.
 - We recently purchased chrome books so our students can take the curriculum there.





- We are looking into accreditation so we can then offer sources of financial help to students.
- Career Point is a great partner because they give assistance to our students.
