b. Intent to apply for the CCCO-CAEP English Language Learner Healthcare Grant Round 3—Eric Crawford

- **Summary:** MCOE would be a strong host site for this opportunity because it is already providing eligible healthcare career pathways and has the necessary infrastructure in place. The funding pool is \$55 million, with 25 grantees expected to be awarded—MLACE will be in the Tier Level one category: up to 1.5M in 3 years. The grant focuses on establishing centers for innovation and impact in health careers, meaning recipients will serve as central hubs that model effective training practices for healthcare workers with English Language support. The consortium will apply as a group with different agency members and partners collaborating to provide these programs.

Important considerations when submitting a one-time request:

A. Definition of one-time proposal: Once every fiscal year

B. The request must meet TWO out of THREE criteria listed above to be considered for one-time funds.

- The requester must submit a one-time proposal form through the consortium members' programs/districts.
- The same consortium members can submit, on behalf of each program– one proposal per fiscal year.
- Requests will be prioritized in these categories:
 - First priority: textbooks/supplies/equipment provided directly to students
 - Second priority: program sustainability (could include capital outlay):
 - Definition and Process for capital outlay request
 - (including building improvements, rental space, leases, construction, vehicles, etc.)
 - Capital outlay expenditures need to be submitted by the requesting Member-district to the consortium's governing board for review and approval.
 - The consortium will review, approve, and establish that the expenditures are aligned with the Consortium's 3-year plan.
 - The consortium will send an informational email to the CAEP Office to inform them of the proposed expenditures.
